In the â??Class Experienceâ?? indicator, which measures the support an institution provides for their online students, four institutions have performed flawlessly with a score of 100 â?? namely, Macquarie Business School, University of Otago Business School, Deakin Business School and Amity Directorate of Distance & Online Education.
